Gold Medalist Augustin Hadelich Wins GRAMMY Award



2006 IVCI Gold Medalist Augustin Hadelich added yet another honor to his list when he won his first GRAMMY award last night for Best Classical Instrumental Solo. The award was for his recording of Henri Dutilleux's Violin Concerto "L'arbre des songes," with the Seattle Symphony under the direction of Ludovic Morlot. Hadelich is also the recipient of an Avery Fisher Career Grant, a Borletti-Buitoni Trust Fellowship, and Lincoln Center's Martin E. Segal Award. The IVCI congratulates Augustin on this remarkable achievement!

The son of German parents, Augustin was born and raised in Italy, but now lives in New York City. He holds an Artist Diploma from The Juilliard School, where he was a student of Joel Smirnoff. He plays on the 1723 "Ex-Kiesewetter" Stradivari violin, on loan from Clement and Karen Arrison through the Stradivari Society of Chicago.
