Jeff Jamner & Jason Seber to Attend Finals in International Violin Competition



"The World is Watching." That is the way that the [International Violin Competition of Indianapolis](#) is promoting itself this year. Indeed, the classical music industry is watching to see which violinists will have a major career launch. This competition is like the Olympics of violin.

[Louisville Youth Orchestra](#) and [Louisville Orchestra](#) Education Conductor Jason Seber and [The Kentucky Center Director of School Programs](#) Jeff Jamner are going to attend the finals on September 17-18. So far, 170 violinists from around the world have applied and 40 were invited to compete. The 16 semi-finalists were just announced (see related article). We are delighted that this list includes former Gheens artists Jinjoo Cho and Tessa Lark.

Why are Jason and Jeff traveling to Indianapolis to the finals? Indeed, they will hear great performances, but this is something more. They are attending the finals to "Discover" their soloist. The Gold Medalist will perform as soloist with the Louisville Orchestra on February 4th in the Gheens Great Expectations Concert in Whitney Hall.
