# IVCI Announces 21/22 Laureate Series, including live and virtual options

Six-concert series will feature two Gold Medalists, two Bronze Medalists and two crossover artists

INDIANAPOLIS – The International Violin Competition of Indianapolis (IVCI) is pleased to announce its 2021/2022 Laureate Series. The six-concert series will include two Gold Medalists: **Richard Lin** (2018) and **Kyoko Takezawa** (1986); and two Bronze Medalists: **Luke Hsu** (2018) and **Soovin Kim** (2002). They will be joined by Indianapolis-based ensembles including the **Indianapolis Chamber Orchestra** (November 20) and the **Ronen Chamber Ensemble** (March 24), plus long-time IVCI pianist **Chih-Yi Chen** (May 17).

Special crossover guests of the Laureate Series include acclaimed violinist Kelly Hall-Tompkins (December 16), and Scandinavian trio Dreamers' Circus (February 1).

Performances will take place in four venues across the city including the Schrott Center for the Arts (November 20), the Madam Walker Theatre (December 16), the Indiana Landmarks Center (February 1 and April 26), and the Frank and Katrina Basile Theater at the Eugene and Marilyn Glick Indiana History Center (March 24 and May 17).

Several performances, postponed from previous seasons due to COVID-19, have been rescheduled into the 21/22 season. The IVCI remains committed to the health of its patrons, musicians and staff, and will continue to keep its patrons aware of safeguard measures recommended by local health and safety officials.
