# IVCI announces 22/23 Laureate Series, including live and virtual options

Six-concert series kicks off the 11<sup>th</sup> Quadrennial Competition, includes Artistic Director Jaime Laredo and four Laureates

INDIANAPOLIS – The International Violin Competition of Indianapolis (IVCI) is pleased to announce its 2022/2023 Laureate Series. The six-concert series will include one Bronze Medalist: **Benjamin Beilman** (2010); three Laureates: **Bella Hristova** (2006), **Ioana Cristina Goicea** (2018) and **Frank Huang** (2002); and IVCI Artistic Director/Jury President **Jaime Laredo**. Two recitals will feature IVCI Official Pianist **Chih-Yi Chen** (September 6 and November 8).

Special crossover guests of the Laureate Series include jazz violinist **Regina Carter** and pianist **Xavier Davis** (February 15), and **Charles Yang** (Time for Three) and pianist **Peter Dugan** (May 9).

All concerts will be performed live, with two available for livestream and on-demand (September 6 and January 24).

Performances will take place in four venues across the city including the **Frank and Katrina Basile Theater** at the **Eugene and Marilyn Glick Indiana History Center** (September 6, November 8 and March 14), **Indiana Landmarks Center** (January 24), the **Madam Walker Theatre** (February 15), and **The Cabaret** (May 9).
